My experience began with picking a chair frame to be transformed. I was inspired to give a traditional frame a fresh and flirty personality with a combination of white velvet and a geometric orange and white fabric from JF Fabrics.

The chair was lovingly reupholstered by my trusted upholsterer at Barrington's Upholstery into a piece of furniture which is fun and formal, sophisticated yet casual.

The mandate for all designers was to express our personality and our 'selves' in the chair's transformation. I don't take myself too seriously and believe that design should fit our lives and be functional while expressing our personalities and lifestyles.
